

**COMBINED NOTICE: FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT/INTENT TO
REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS**

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

On or about November 29, 2013 the above-named Town of Glade Spring will request the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) to be used for the following project:

Glade Spring Downtown Revitalization Project

Revitalization of the central business district by façade improvements to commercial buildings, demolition of two severely blighted structures, adaptive reuse of a blighted structure for use as a year-round indoor farmers market, placement of wayfinding signage throughout the town, construction of approximately 300 linear feet of sidewalk, and creation of a commercial microloan program

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and, accordingly, the above-named Town of Glade Spring has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows:

- a) Façade improvements, demolition of severely blighted properties, and renovation of a blighted warehouse for use as a year-round indoor Farmers Market will not involve disturbance of any previously undisturbed ground.
- b) A survey of the Federal database concludes that no wetlands are located within the project area. A similar survey concludes that no endangered species are located within the project area.
- c) A review of FIRM/FEMA flood maps indicate that there will be no impact to either the floodplain or existing waterways.
- d) An archive search conducted as part of the Section 106 Review process has determined that no documented archaeological sites are located in the project area.
- e) A programmatic agreement will be completed between the Town and the Virginia Department of Historic Resources to ensure all renovation is consistent with state historical preservation guidelines.
- f) Short periods characterized by some dust and noise pollution generated by construction activities will be the only adverse environmental condition generated by this project.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the Glade Spring Downtown Revitalization Project has been made by the Town of Glade Spring which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request, at the Town Hall located at 113 E. Glade Street, Glade Spring, Virginia between the 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted, prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the town to the office of the undersigned. Such written comments should be received at the address specified on or before

November 28, 2013. All such comments so received will be considered and the Town of Glade Spring will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to November 29, 2013. Comments should specify which aspect of the environmental review they are addressing.

INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS

The Town of Glade Spring will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development, under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. Glade Spring is certifying to DHCD that Glade Spring and The Honorable Lee Coburn in his official capacity as Mayor, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval, Glade Spring may use the Community Development Block Grant funds, and DHCD will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and related laws and authorities. DHCD will accept an objection to its approval of the Release of Funds and acceptance of the Town's Certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or DHCD's actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if it is on one of the following bases: (a) that the certification was not in fact executed by the chief executive officer or other officer of applicant approved by DHCD; (b) that applicant's Environmental Review Record for the project indicates omission of a required decision, finding, or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process; (c) the grant recipient has committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD/State; (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality.
